




The Largest Jewish Population in the Bay Area



Feeling Welcome and Feeling a Part

- In the East Bay, **81%** of respondents feel welcome at the events and **37%** feel a part of the Jewish community;
- In Contra Costa, sense of belonging is the highest among families with young children 52%, with the average East Bay at 32%;
- In Contra Costa, sense of belonging is the lowest among young adults 23%, with the average East Bay at 31%.




■ Feeling welcome attending events and activities sponsored by Jewish groups




